

THERAPEUTIC WARMING SYSTEM

FDA Approved Indications for Use:

The ReBound System is to be used to generate deep heat within body tissues for the treatment of medical conditions such as relief of pain, muscle spasms and joint contractures.

American Medical Association (AMA) Definition of Diathermy:

Creates heat in the soft tissues, due to resistance offered by the tissues by the passage of high frequency electrical currents. The objective of this treatment is to cause vasodilation and/or muscle relaxation, with subsequent pain relief. Diathermy can cause a greater rise in deep tissue temperature than any form of infrared energy.

The ReBound System is contraindicated for use in patients who have:

- Implanted stimulators such as deep brain stimulators, spinal cord stimulators, and cardiac pacemakers. Also, make certain the implanted leads are not still in place after the stimulator has been removed as this would represent a serious hazard.
- Impaired blood clotting
- Malignancies
- Acute inflammation
- Impaired sensation
- Impaired cognition
- Acute pelvic inflammatory disease
- Women who are pregnant

The ReBound System is contraindicated in an area over:

- Developing fetus
- Developing gonads
- Metal implants

General Warnings and Precautions:

- Children under the age of 18 should not use the ReBound System over growth plates.
- It is not recommended for a patient with poorly vascularized tissue(s) to receive a ReBound treatment.
- Patients with areas of thermal insensitivity should not receive a ReBound treatment over the affected area.
- Patients with acute joint effusion should not receive a ReBound treatment.
- Patients should not receive a ReBound treatment over the ocular and orbital regions (eye area).
- Patients with an intrauterine device should not receive a ReBound treatment over this area.

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
